Landmark Papers in Psychiatry Dec 26 2019 Advances in the practice of psychiatry have occurred in "fits and starts" over the last several decades. These advances are evident to anyone long affiliated with the field and are best appreciated through direct experience of living through the times. These advances can also be gleaned from historical overviews in textbooks or the recollections of one's teachers and mentors. Returning to the original papers that have ushered in these changes is rarely done for various, mostly practical, reasons. Filtering through thousands of articles in psychiatry may prove daunting, access to the manuscripts may be limited (especially for papers not available electronically), and understanding their impact requires a broader context. Moreover, with so much active research currently occurring in various branches of psychiatry, current practitioners or trainees may find their attention focused on the present, and this is reinforced by electronic search algorithms, which return articles in reverse chronological order. Not surprisingly, citations for articles in virtually all fields decline precipitously for articles

over five years old. As scholars and professionals, we are losing touch with our academic heritage. Yet navigating the future of psychiatry requires a firm understanding of its past. This resource serves as a guide for anyone seeking to understand the evolution of psychiatry as a scientific discipline. It does so by summarizing over 100 landmark papers in psychiatry and placing their scientific contributions within a historical context. An introductory section sets the stage for the major theoretical constructs within the field, with chapters devoted to ontology and nosology. Subsequent sections examine major facets of the theory and practice of psychiatry, such as pathogenesis of psychiatric illness, pharmacotherapy, psychotherapy, and somatic treatments. These sections are divided logically into chapters addressing important contributions to the understanding and treatment of specific disorders. A final section explores ethical considerations within each field. This framework echoes the complexity of psychiatry, which cannot be reduced to a single set of diagnoses or subspecialty categories. Is Critique Secular? Dec 18 2021 This volume interrogates settled ways of thinking about the seemingly interminable conflict between religious and secular values in our world today. Taking as their point of departure the question of whether critique belongs exclusively to forms of liberal democracy that define themselves in opposition to religion, these authors consider the case of the "Danish cartoon controversy" of 2005. Metatextbook of Medicine Feb 08 2021 This is a small selected bibliography of about 2,500 references to free medical review articles which have been selected because they are of interest to pupils, students and established healthcare professionals to work as the first

scientific review articles they ever read, to be a source of inspiration of where-to-go and what-to-do, and to be some self-administered CME load to learn what is going on out there. It is a subcollection of my Metatextbook-of-Medicine on <http://www.kidney.de>, which originally shows 75.000 references to free medical review articles, which are tagged to 13.000 concepts and single-term items to cover all aspects of medicine and the life sciences. While tagging references 30.000 up to 75.000, I specifically selected these few papers for inclusion of a subcollection serving those who want to be inspired by a bibliography rather than to select a random concept of 13.000 and to start from there - those professional people with essentially no knowledge on the cell cycle, on optical imaging, on running a clinical trial, on basic laboratory methodology, on treating cancer or the vasculitides - and indeed, the pupil as well as the senior physician will be enlightened by the material I referred to. Nobody can be of current knowledge on the things out of his immediate scope, but indeed, he or she should have an approach to accessing a hot spot projection out of the whole literature. Today, it needs one weeks time from formulating a search strategy for a literature database like pubmed and having collected all the papers regarded as relevant to the topic choosen. Today, the smallest ideas give 4 folders of papers, if retrieval was run with sensitive roc. Since it is not possible to apply this approach beyond single highly-targeted questions to keep up with the ideas around, I designed the whole Metatextbook as "the review collection for wikipedia" - the spirit of an encyclopedia which is devoid of any own textual contents but which refers to a multitude of barrier-free accessible originally published review articles to introduce users into a topic. I started the first 30.000 items on 3.000 topics on a default wikipedia collector and migrated into an unidirectional system of stable bibliographies which got published in early 2012 at about 60.000 items in 10.000 topics. As shown above, this special, small subcollection of random sorted papers with the appeal of showing very interesting things is like carving out Proc-Natl-Acad-Sci-U-S-A from the wealth of 35M papers published in the life sciences, and it is reminiscent of going-copying in my early 90's when starting my studies in human medicine. My readers (better, those of the authors whose work I have simply tagged and brought into focus) will enjoy having access to this small collection. You will decide whether my approach of giving you some marvellous but random stuff is something like an advent calendar, out of 24 items given, you will like one, so you have 100 little doors to open and look behind...

The Free Paper in America Jun 12 2021 **THE FREE PAPER IN AMERICA: STRUGGLE FOR SURVIVAL** is the only book of its kind in print. It tells the story of local community free papers, a lusty stepchild that has now surpassed all weekly paid papers and even daily newspapers in circulation - but ignored by orthodox journalistic circles. Written by a publisher for 40 years, with masters degree from Medill School of Journalism, the book explains the evolution from "barely legible mimeographed sheets" to quality status very comparable to their paid brethren. Despite the stereotype that these papers are merely all-ad "throwaways," some 65% carry news content and of this number, 48% print 25% or more news. Still, the newspaper industry treats them as "the enemy" to be eliminated. The book traces the parallel rise of daily newspaper monopolies and chain ownership, tells why the Joint Operating Agreements were necessary, and furnishes an exclusive history and rare defense of the FCC's Cross-Ownership ban. The author argues that although still considered "the problem," local independent free papers are "the answer" to spreading monopoly within print journalism.
